



Frequently Asked Questions

What age groups are the experiments designed to support?

The experiments are designed to support learners from Stage 4 to Stage 6.

Are the lessons aligned with the National Curriculum?

All the lessons are aligned with Version 9 of the National Curriculum.

How much time do teachers need to allow to complete all the lessons? It is anticipated all the lessons will take between 6-10 hours to complete in total.

Is someone available to support the delivery of the lessons?

DeadlyScience has staff who can be contacted by phone and email to support the delivery of lessons and gathering of feedback. These staff are not available to visit Centres.

Do Centre's need to input learner average data on the Kickin' It portal housed on the DeadlyScience website?

This portal is designed so Centre's can share average results from the experiments and compare this with other Centre data. This can be used to support friendly interactivity across the Centres without use of individual data or names.

Why are Centre's asked to provide feedback and data?

As part of the agreement with the Department of Industry, Science and Resources, DeadlyScience is required to collect data from all youth and youth detention centres that engaged with the DeadlyLabs project. The scope of data collection is limited to testimonials, feedback surveys and copies of activity pages being returned by email or post.

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
